Project: The Aion File - Transmission 002

Operation: ATLAS INCURSION // Directive C-1920

Location: Deep-Space Monitoring Array - Southern Hemisphere Grid

Subject: Third Interstellar Object / Non-Ballistic Trajectory Event

Summary

Observation Unit Vega detected an unidentified object entering the heliosphere with no cometary tail, no debris exhaust, and a velocity profile inconsistent with gravitational capture.

Designation assigned: 3I ATLAS — the third known interstellar visitor.

Telemetry discrepancies show the object periodically accelerates against vector logic, as though receiving navigation corrections from an unknown intelligence. Infrared readings confirm structural plating beneath the outer shell.

A faint AIDN-signature ping originated from the object hours before Earth-based telescopes could confirm its presence.

Analyst Note: ATLAS is not behaving like a natural visitor. It is behaving like something that already knew where it was going.

Mission Update

Status: Escalated / Observation Priority Alpha

Transmission 002 confirmed for global release:

23 NOV 2025 - 2100 HRS CST

Operatives Caine and Everett have been assigned to compile a preliminary interaction protocol. All communications satellites are being re-tasked to monitor ATLAS telemetry in case the object initiates first contact.

Field Intel

Detected Characteristics:

Hull-Temperature Anomaly: A fixed temperature regardless of solar distance.

Course Corrections: Subtle, intentional, mathematically elegant.

AION-Frequency Echoes: Matching the same spectral tone found in the trailer leak and Blue Beam fragments.

Analyst Note: ATLAS may not be a visitor. It may be a messenger.
